

# Quiz Night for The Wish Centre



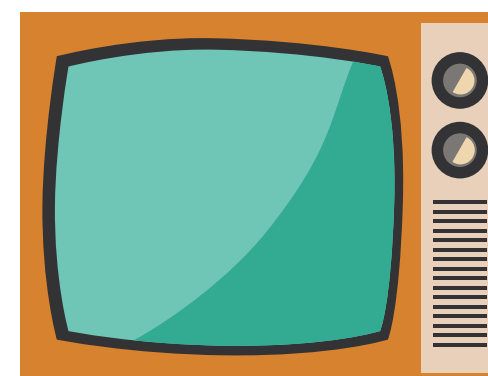
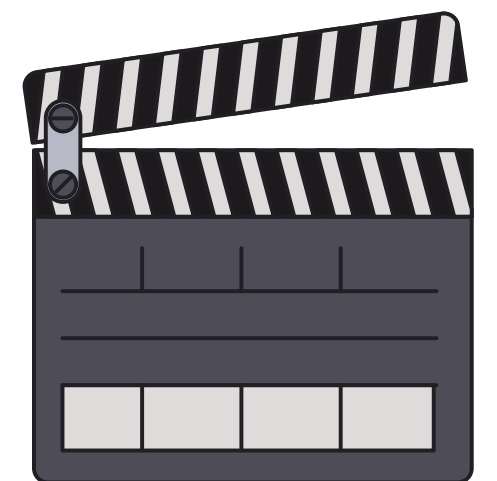
**Test your general knowledge,

Thank you for hosting a quiz night in aid of The Wish Centre. Domestic abuse impacts over 1.2 million women a year and 675,000 men - and these are just the numbers that are reported. We know many are suffering but are yet to reach out for the support they need. The event you're hosting will help ensure that we're there for those in need, whenever they reach out to us, and can provide tailored, holistic support.

This pack has been designed to be easy to use and will hopefully contain all you need for a fun night in (except the snacks....sorry about that). We've created 8 rounds of 8 questions which should mean that there's something for everyone. If you choose 6 rounds your quiz should last about 90 minutes, but you can cut the number of questions down to 5 or 6 per round if you prefer or cut out another round or two. We've also added some ideas for fun quick rounds for extra points.

First pick your date and, if you can't get together in person, pick a platform to host it on. Zoom, Houseparty and Skype are all good ones. Let people know it's for charity and give them a suggested amount to donate - £5 or £10 per team or individual donations if you prefer, every penny really does make a difference. # What to say on the night.....



**Firstly, on our behalf, please say thank you to everyone who has joined you.**

**Explain that every penny raised allows us to provide holistic support for adults and children impacted by domestic abuse.**

**Introduce yourself as the Quiz Master and make sure everyone has a pen and paper and, of course, a team name. Make a note of the team names on your score sheet. Explain how many rounds you've decided to do and how many questions in each.**

**Joker round - each team has one joker which they can play to double the score of a chosen round. They need to play the joker before the questions in that round start and can only use it once.**

**Remind everyone to mute their microphones when you're asking the questions so as they can all hear you properly and the teams can confer with each other without being overhead.**

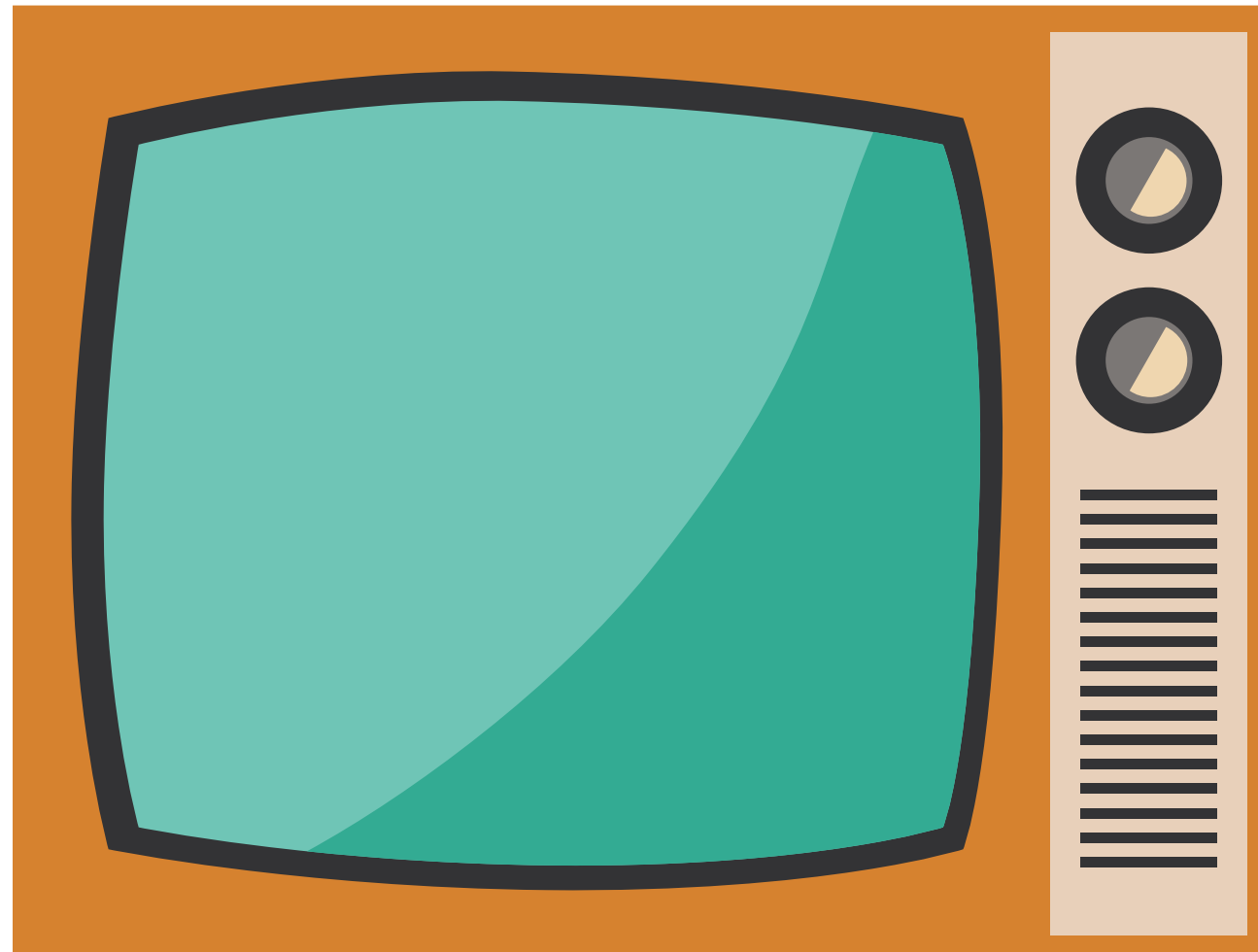

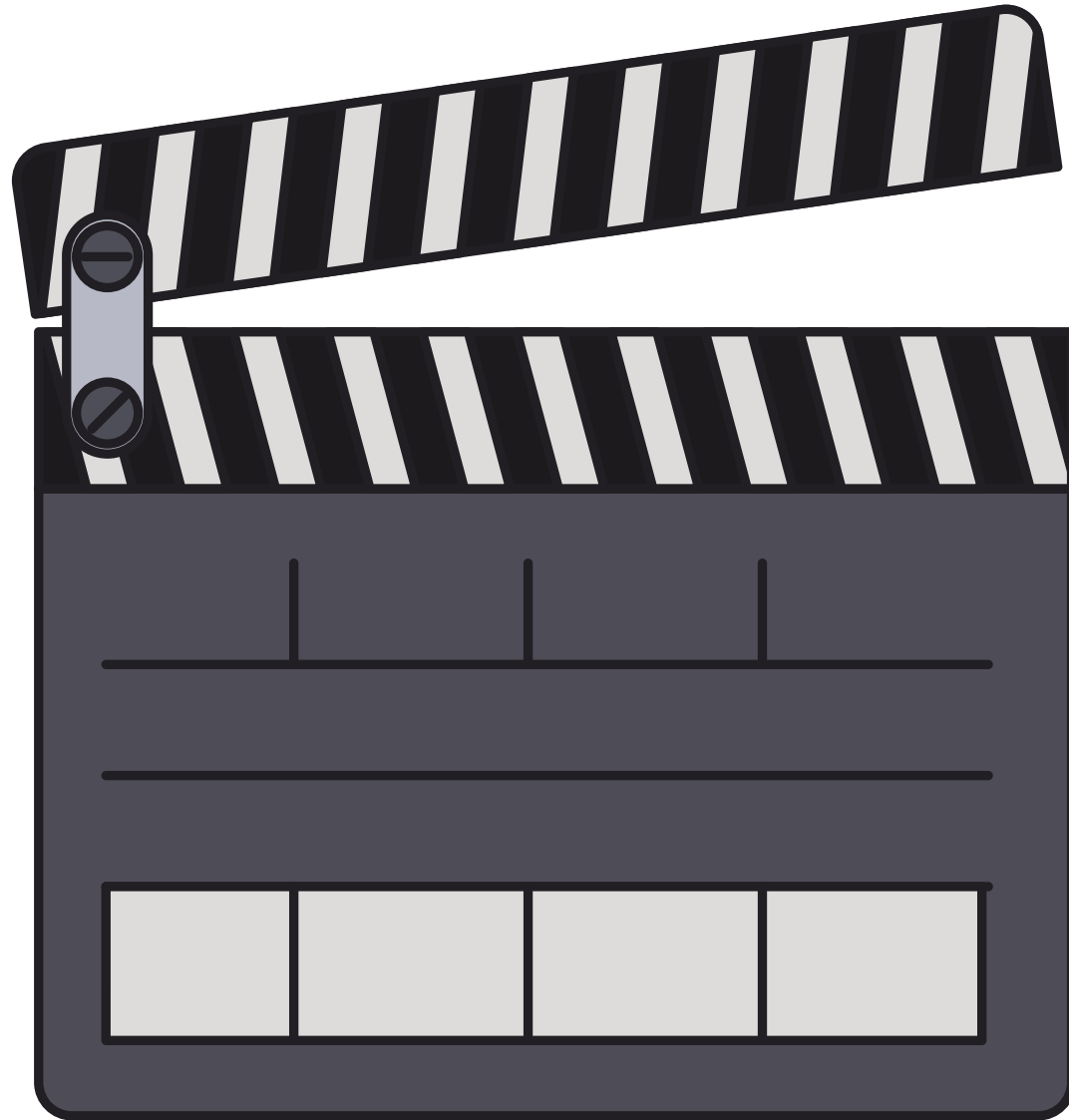

# Quick, fun rounds

A few ideas for fun rounds for extra points or to replace other categories....

Scavenger Hunt - Provide a list of objects and see who can find the most in two minutes.

Physical Challenge - Hold the longest plank or do the most sit ups/press ups in a minute.

Construction Contest - Build the tallest structure in a minute using items shorter than a tin of beans.

Take Aim - Throw a tea bag into a mug from the furthest distance, longest wins.

Scattergories - 60 seconds to write down as many things on a given topic (animals, brands, foods, names, etc) starting with a given letter.

Think Quick - Take it in turns to name themed items (e.g. things that float, things with wheels, a boys name) - but no repetitions or hesitations!

# **A little bit about where your money goes**

**£5 will buy a personal attack alarm**
